# Introduction

E-book Weaver is great low cost software that compiles HTML files (web pages) into one single executable file (.exe) that, when opened, looks like a web browser.

Because the files you start with are HTML you can incorporate more features into your pages such as audio, video and Flash, than you can with many other formats.

E-book Weaver is very easy to use and has help files throughout to guide you in creating truly professional E-Books.

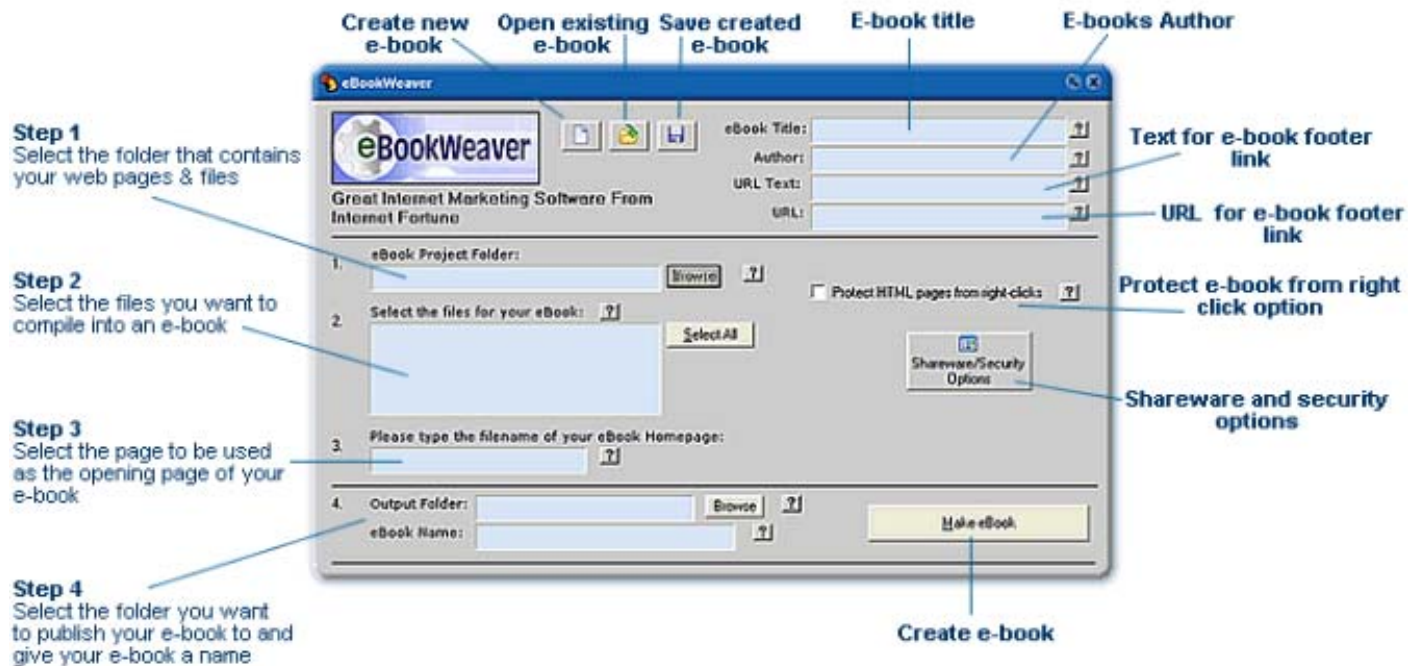
There are a couple of golden rules to remember when using E-book Weaver and if these are followed you will have trouble free software usage time and time again.

**Golden Rule No. 1** - All files must be in the same folder

**Golden Rule No. 2** - Incorporate any external JavaScript files into your web pages, not as separate files.

# Creating Your E-Book

After installation, open E-book Weaver which will look like this:



**Step 1** - The first step is to browse to the folder where your web files are kept. Remember that all files need to be in the same folder and any JavaScript needs to be contained in your web pages and not in external files.

**Step 2** - Select the files from the list that you want to include in your e-book. If all files are required, click 'Select All'.

**Step 3** - Type in the file name of your e-book homepage. Shortcut Tip – Triple clicking on your chosen homepage in the box above (Step 2) will select the page, insert it into the box automatically and tick it again.

**Step 4** - Browse to the folder where you'd like your e-book to be saved.

**Step 5** - Give your e-book a name

## Interim Steps

Give your e-book a title

Insert the author name

Create a web link (URL) at the footer of your e-book

Protect your compiled e-book from right clicking (Please note: this adds code to your web pages so be sure you want this before proceeding)

Add password or shareware function to your e-book

**Step 6** – Click 'Make e-book'

## Shareware / Security Features

If you want to protect your e-book, E-book Weaver has two very useful features that may help. However, please be aware that expiry functions and passwords are not 100% secure and may be bypassed by someone with sufficient computer knowledge.


### Expire after X days

This function is useful for shareware. After a set number of days your e-book will expire.

### Lock e-book with password

Add a password to your e-book that your customer will need to input before opening.

**Please Note:** Your customer will only have to do this the very first time they open it. After that, it will open without password.

## Increased Security

If you'd like more control over the use/refunds of your e-books and a higher level of security, E-book Weaver is fully compatible with Remote Locker.

Remote Locker is a unique security system specially designed to take .exe files that you've created in E-book Weaver and lock them in a 'vault' which can only be opened using a unique access key. A unique access key is generated automatically by Remote Locker each time you sell an e-book.

In your Remote Locker control panel you can then view the times it's been opened and the IP address of the system that's using it.

If your customer requests a refund, you simply terminate their access key in your control panel and the next time they try to open it, it will be locked.
